BOOKS ON THE FINE ARTS

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This catalogue, comprising a selection from the acquisitions we made within the last few months, contains a number of valuable books and Library sets very rarely found for sale. We are thus in a position to offer an opportunity, such as will seldom occur again, to any library or collector desirous to acquire fine copies, solidly bound, of the most important works on the Fine Arts, Bibliography, History and Geography.

We have been enabled to present this unusual selection chiefly by two fortunate circumstances, the disposal of a number of Duplicates of the **Imperial Library** in Vienna and the sale of the famous old **Inzaghi-Library**, both secured by our firm.

The renowned Vienna Imperial Library having been taken over by the Austrian Republic together with some other special libraries formed by members of the former Imperial Family, has exchanged a number of duplicates resulting from this combination against other works not possessed so far by that institute. The duplicates dispensed with come mostly from the former private collection of the Emperor Francis I. (1792—1835) and thus we find in this catalogue the marvellous copy of Napoleons great work on Egypt (No. 386) with coloured plates on papier velin, which we reproduce as a frontispice of this catalogue. This copy must have been presented to Francis I., who was the father of Marie Louise and thus Napoleon's father-in-law. Thus also we can offer an unparalleled copy of the *Paléographie Universelle* (No. 609) in full red morocco with the Imperial arms, the magnificently bound *Didot-Classics* (No. 128, 137, 145) and many other precious and important works, which from their first publication, partly for their original cost and partly for their size, were hardly ever found in private

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collections but were only subscribed by the great princely libraries of Europe and thus change hands but very rarely. We therefore recommend this catalogue especially to Librarians of Universities and other learned Institutions who will find a number of indispensable standard works, some of which may have been on their list of desiderata for many years, without occurring for sale.

The **Inzaghi-Library**, also incorporated in this catalogue, was formed by the Counts **Inzaghi**, a noble family of Lombard origin, now long extinct. By the purchase of property in Styria they entered the ranks of the Styrian nobility, settled down in Graz, were created Barons in 1663 and Counts of the Holy Roman Empire by a diploma of September 2nd 1686*).

The Inzaghi-books are nearly all bound in fine solid pigskin and mostly bear, beside the beautiful engraved armorial **book-plate**, (See **reprod.** on last page of cover) an autograph note of ownership by one of the **Inzaghi's** on the title-page, usually with the precise date of acquisition. We do not know which of them it was, that laid the foundations of this extensive library, comprising nearly all branches of knowledge but chiefly Geography, Travels and History; but we mostly find the autographs of Johann Philipp Count Inzaghi (ab. 1675) Joh. Anton (born 1686) and Franz Carl (died 1744); often not confining themselves to a bald entry of ownership, but adding notes on the margins or title-pages of considerable interest

Fine copy of an interesting Milan incunable which contains 52 letters of the Pope addressed to the Emperor Frederic, King Ferdinand, the Duke of Modena, to Isabella, Queen of Sicily, to the Sultan Mahomet and many other prominent persons of the time, in which he deals with the war against the Turks, the life and canonisation of St. Catherine of Siena and various other ecclesiastical and political questions.

Some leaves repaired in margins, otherwise fine and complete copy of a rare and interesting Hebrew incunable. — Soncino, a castle in Lombardy, was the seat of a learned and rich Jewish family, who derived their family-name from their residence; they established a press for the production of Hebrew books, which was conducted by Joshua Solomon and his two nephews Gerson and Solomon ben Moses Soncino; the actual printer however was Abraham ben Rabbi Chajjim de Tintori. All imprints of this famous press are very rare.

It is needless to comment on the extreme rarity of Early Printed Books on Vellum. Only two other copies of this book printed on vellum are known: one passed from the Riccardi-Library at Florence into that of the Accademia della Crusca and is mentioned by Van Praet; Bibl. Part. III. p. 9. No. 13; the other is in the Bibl. Nat. Paris; Pell. 1125. The book itself (Hain-Cop. 1577) even on paper is, like all Naples-incunabula, of the greatest rarity; there is no copy at all in the United States; it is wanting in the British Museum, in the Bodleian and in all German Libraries. Fava e Bresciano: *La Stampa a Napoli* (1911) II. p. 160 No. 188, enumerating all copies known, on paper and on vellum, mention, beside ours, six in Italian Libraries, two in Paris, one in Vienna and one in Kopenhagen, omitting the Bassano-Spencer-copy, now in Manchester, described by Dibdin (Bibl. Spenc. VII. No. 17).

The „Aquila Volante“ is a world-chronicle with the prevalent tendency of glorifying the Roman Emperors in general and Julius Caesar in particular, an apotheosis of Triumphant Rome in the spirit characteristic of the Italian Renaissance. — Dibdin, following Fossi and Mazzuchelli doubts the authorship of Leonardo Bruni Aretino, which however is clearly asserted in this, the first, edition. The work contains large quotations from Dante and the „Tesoro“ of Brunetto Latini.

The most remarkable feature perhaps of this extraordinary volume is the woodcut border on the first page of text, a rich composition of ornaments enlivened by putti and animals, (See *Reprod.*) in that curious mixed style reminding more of Spanish than of Italian work, which is characteristic of so much Neapolitan Art under the Aragon-dynasty and of Neapolitan woodcuts of the period in particular. This border is undoubtedly designed by the same artist who decorated the *Tuppo Aesop*. Cp. Fava e Bresciano: Tav. XLVI and XLVIII. In our copy this border, being much larger than the text, is rather narrowly shaved on outer margin. — Otherwise our vellum-copy is a stately, large one, printed on stout vellum, which is in places slightly stained and browned in margins, but still shows off the beautiful type of the letterpress and the rich blackness of the woodcuts with a lustre lacking in any paper-copy.

These woodcuts, the work of a great artist formerly designed as the „Master of Bergmann's printing office“, are now widely recognized as the work of **Albert Dürer**, who resided in Bâle as a young man in 1494 for a few months on his way to Italy. (See D. Burckhardt in *Jahrb. d. K. Preuß. Kunstsammlgn.* XXVIII. p. 168 and M. Friedländer: *Dürer*, pp. 21—25.) These woodcuts are seen in most excellent impressions in our copy and are all uncoloured.

A fine copy of a very rare incunable with **three wonderful woodcuts** which show 1) (on vo of title): St. Catherine sitting on a throne and giving her book to Beatrice d'Este and to Isabella of Aragon 2) (f. a₁) St. Catherine dictating her dialogues to three secretaries sitting before her 3) (on vo x₇) St. Catherine before an altar praying with folded hands.

As Hain gives 3 editions of this incunable which, although showing different years, bear exactly the same dates of month and day, we must suppose that only a single edition has appeared, which has been differently

dated for some reason. Regarding this question and the authorship of the woodcuts Essling says: „Les bois du v. AA et du r. a peuvent être attribués au graveur dont nous avons signalé la technique bien particulière à propos du Pulci, Ciriffo Calvaneo, circa 1492. Le dernier bois est d'une autre main, moins habile“.

par Hain (II p. 68), qui signale, en outre, une édition de 1482, du même imprimeur, et avec le quatrième: XVI de marzo. Les deux mots: marzo (mars) et mazo (dialecte vénitien, pour maggio-mai) pouvant facilement se confondre à la lecture, nous serions ainsi en présence de trois éditions publiées le même jour, dans les trois années 1482, 1483 et 1494. Cette coïncidence nous paraît d'autant plus suspecte que ces éditions seraient de tout point identiques, sauf la modification du millésime . . ."

We are of opinion that this book cannot possibly have been printed in 1483, considering that M. Capcasa's earliest book with a certain date is the Ovid of 31 Dec. 1488 and we cannot suppose a gap of five years between the first and the second book from this press. On the other hand we suggest that, seeing there are considerable variants in copies as noted by Reichling II. p. 143 and IV. p. 177, there might be an edition of 17. V. 1493 with the date misprinted 1483 as in our and the Correr-copy; and another of 17. V. 1494 with the date correctly printed as in the Rivoli copy or VB 4071 or Pellechet 3390.

Hain 8566 (not seen) Proctor 5765. „The book is divided into three parts by three frontispieces or half-titles, cut on wood and enclosed in ornamental borders, the pages of text facing these being also in borders and bearing a double woodcut and large capital. Part I. containing the life of S. Jerome, has 17 column-cuts; Part II. has 120; Part. III. has 41. At the end of Part II. is an upright cut of S. Jerome and his lion enclosed in a pretty border. The woodcuts are in the Venetian style, but are nearer akin to the Dante of 1491 than to the Malermi-Bible. The designs, however, are good, and many of the little cuts, especially some of those illustrating conventual life, are very interesting, and often show an almost humorous naïveté.“ (Catalogue of the Early Italian Books in the collection of C. W. Dyson Perrins. No. 124).

The dedication on verso of second title, which varies in different copies, is here addressed to Augustino Barbadico; in other copies it is directed to Hercole or to Leonora d'Este.

The first and second title page are entirely xylographic and consist of large Gothic characters with flourishes cut on wood. **Our copy is quite complete with the „Vita“ so often wanting and with all the beautiful borders intact, entirely untouched by colour and in the orig. binding.** A copy bound in vellum priced £ 250 in a recent catalogue. 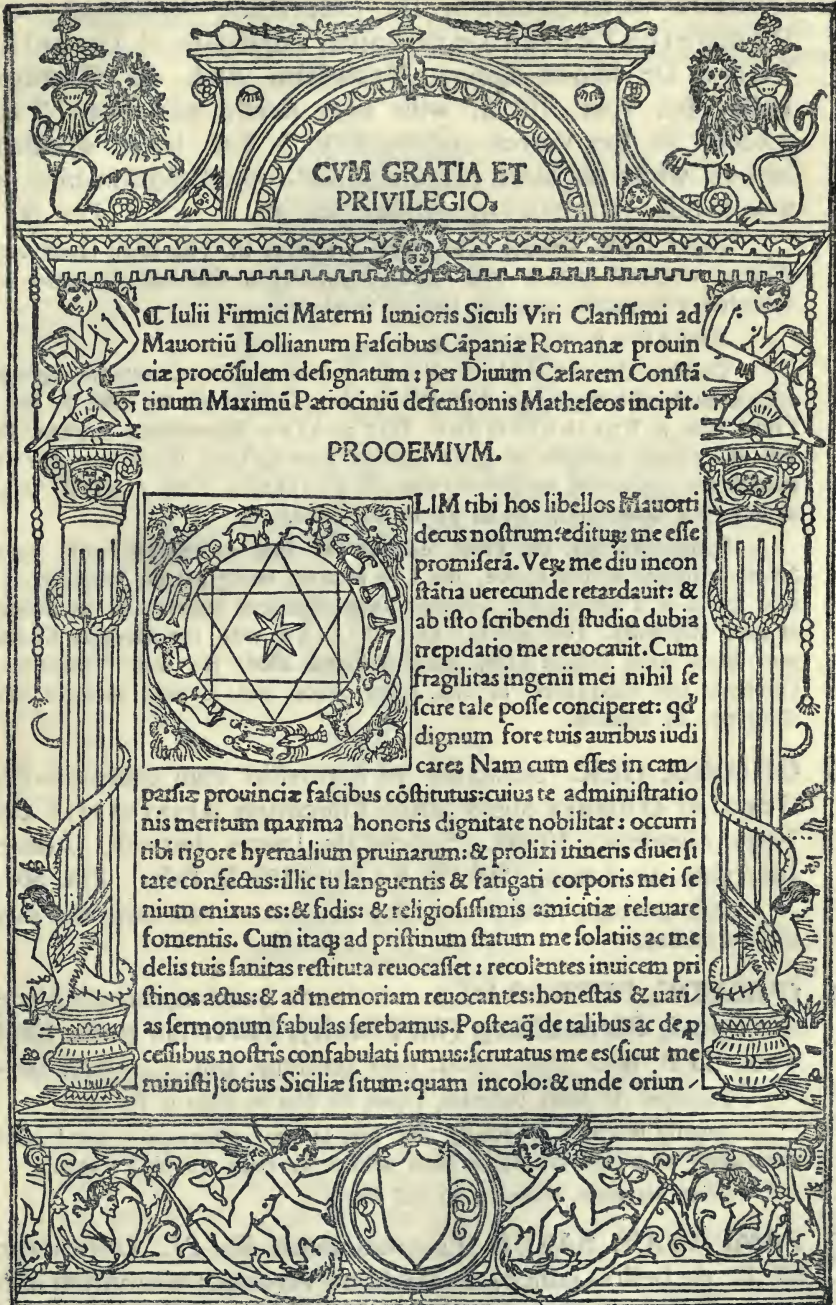

The type, a gothic character measuring 110 mm for 20 lines, has not been definitely assigned yet to any press, but is ascribed to Creussner by Haebler and Voullième. Our copy is in fine condition with full margins, with only four insignificant tears in the margins only, not affecting the text.

Very rare like all single-leaf impressions of the XV th century and an interesting document as a genuine specimen of an indulgence, such as they were sold for cash by itinerant friars, a practice which was one of the causes of the Reformation-movement.

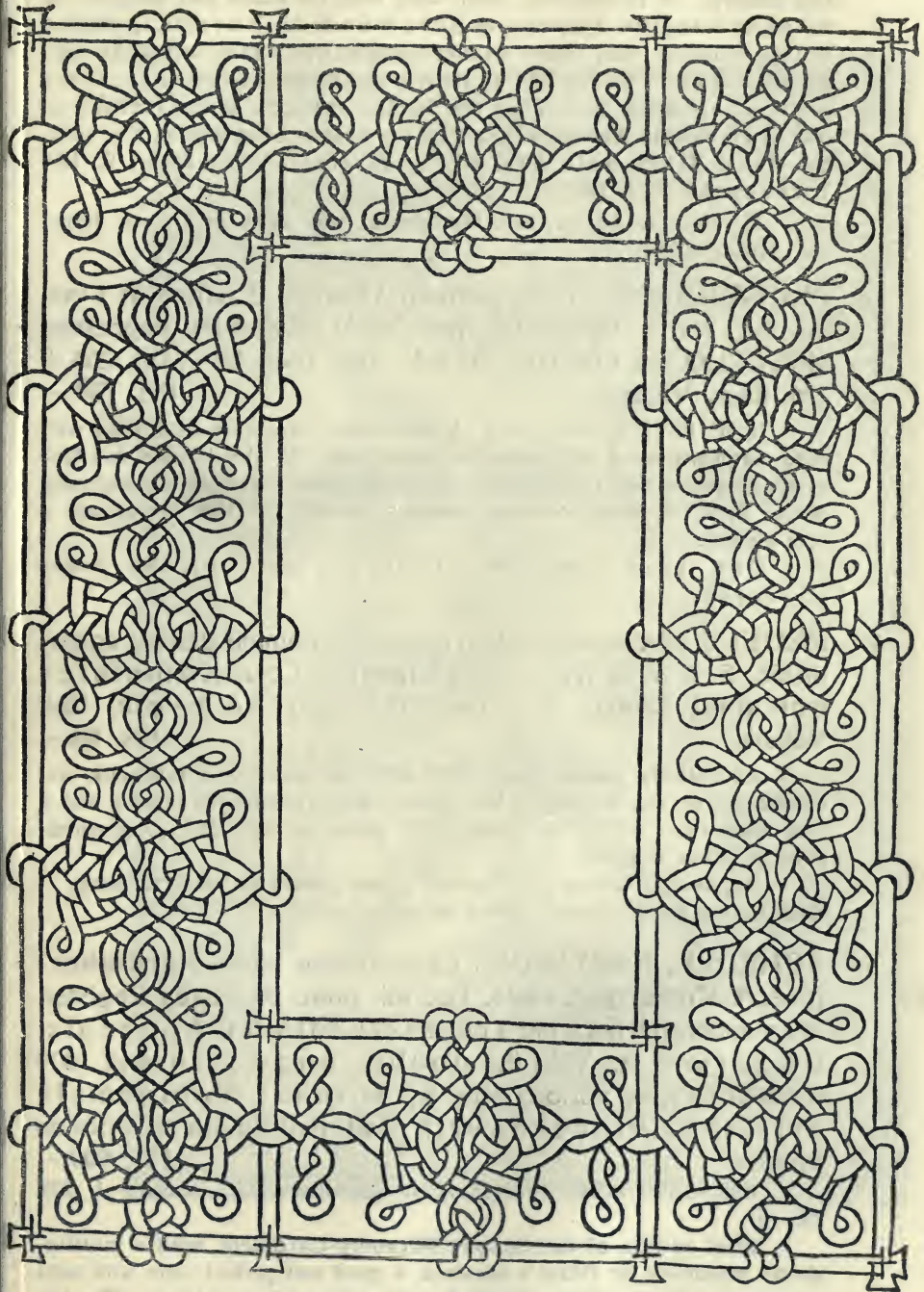

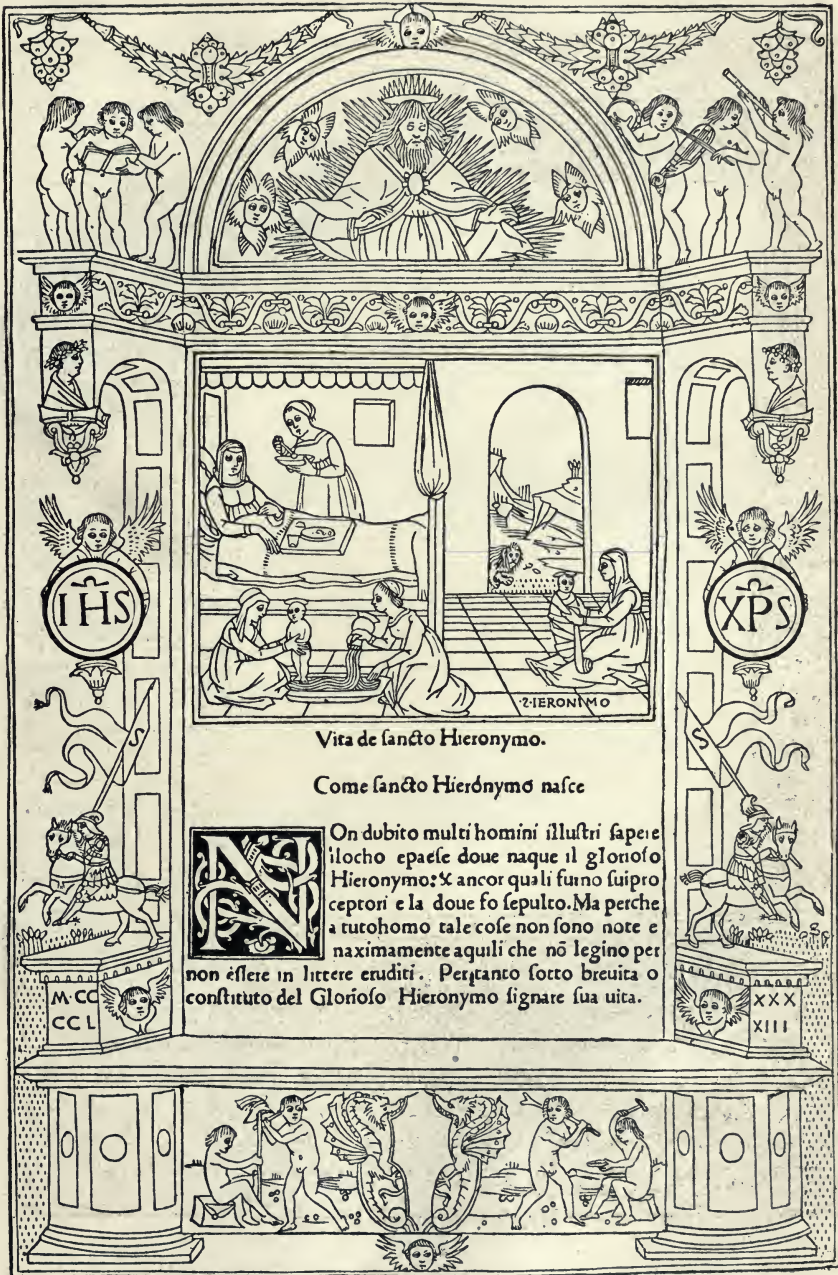

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on the Sovereignty of the People. He derives the Imperial power from the people, who entrust their sovereign legislative rights to the Roman Emperor, but retain their supremacy, at least in theory, with regard to legislation as well as the executive. Thus he opposed the Papal theory of temporal power derived from Divine Authority and imparted to the Emperors by their Coronation by the Church.

Very fine copy of an extremely rare book; on the title: „Ex Haereditate H. Gut H. Blotius emit 1585“. Blotius was the first Librarian of the Vienna Imperial Library and one of the greatest savants of his time. (died 1608).

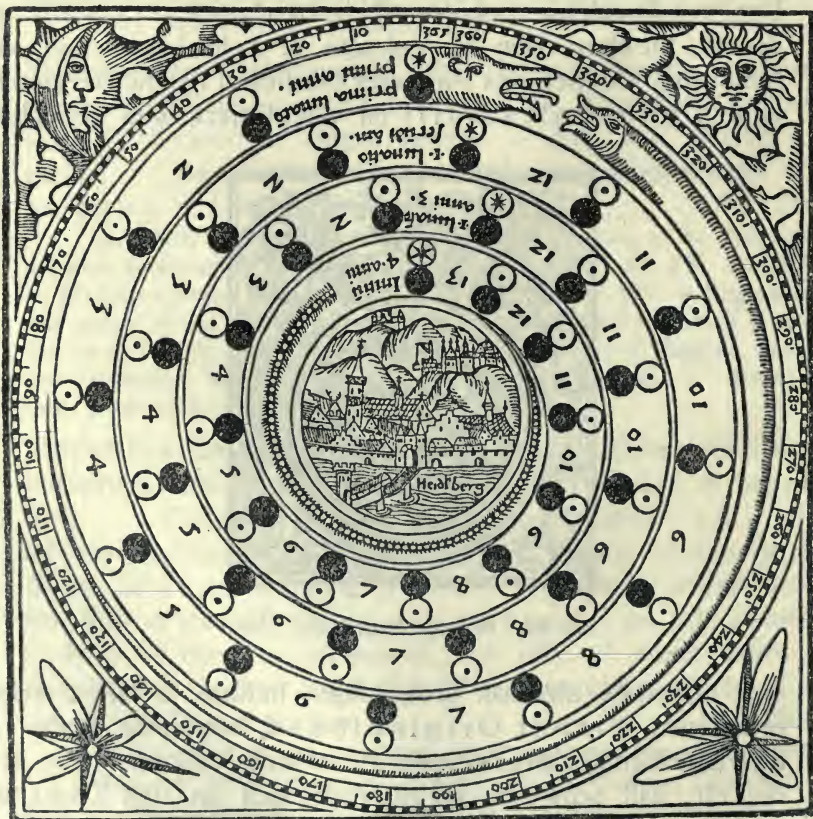

Heidelb. Schlosses*. Vol. II, p. 277 in 1890. It represents the only certain view of the old castle before its entire destruction by lightning in 1533.

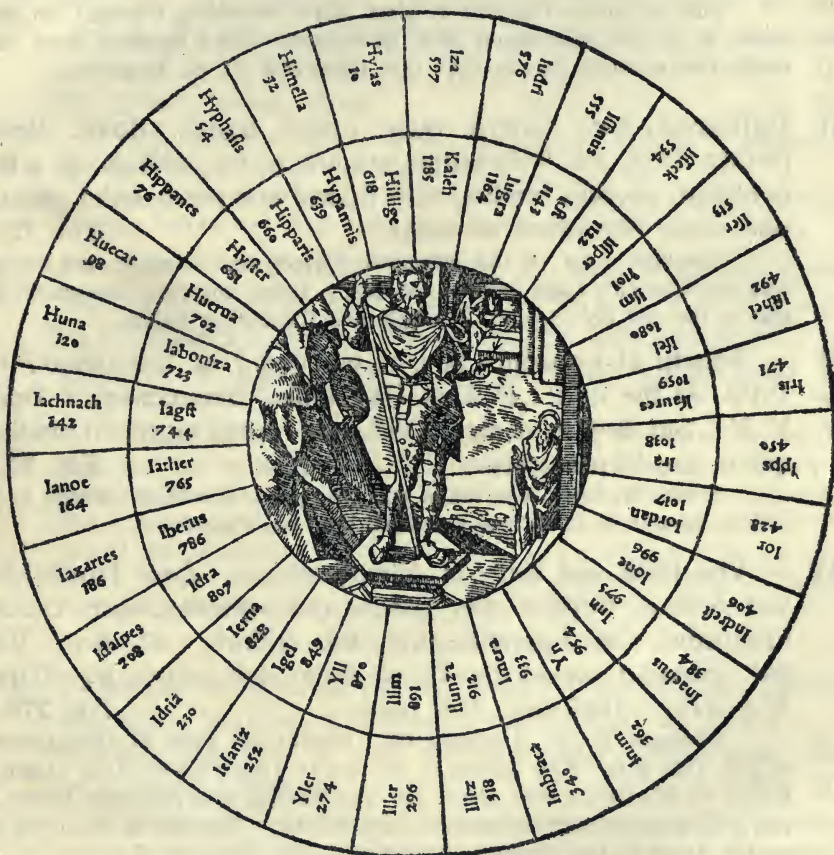

Each of the 12 chapters treats, in the manner of *Lent*-sermons, of one of the capital *Sins*, which are designed as the 12 sons of „*Carnival*“; each chapter is preceded by a curious allegorical woodcut of one *Sin*, na-

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med: Presumption, Avarice, Pride, Drunkenness, Fury, Envy, Flattery, Blasphemy, Curiosity, Idleness, Garrulity and Fraud.

The author of this extraordinary popular book in Czech was dean of the church in Šlan. The woodcuts are strongly reminiscent of those current in France as the Appendix to Rabelais' Pantagruel.

A very curious and rare book. Scalichius (born Zagreb 1534 died 1575) was a Croatian priest, first Catholic, then Protestant, finally reconverted to Catholicism. Most of his writings deal with occult philosophy, medicine and magic. This commentary to the famous and much commented prophecies of Joachim of Flores (died 1202) is very curious and the woodcut-illustrations most remarkable.

First edition, very rare. Panzer (Annalen I, 645) gives a long description of this book. Proctor 10675. Sebast. Brant has contributed a foreword and a Poem in German occupying 6 pages, and Jacob. Locher (Philomusus) has written a Latin Epistle and Epigram of 4 pages. The remarkable woodcuts which are in good impressions, represent criminal trials and punishments, with scenes of torture etc. One of them bears the signature of artist H F (Hans Furtenbach or Hans Frank, s. Nagler p. 316, 6, Passav. III, 440.)

Our copy being throughout somewhat stained by use or water has some slight wormholes in title-leaf and 2 or 3 leaves slightly mended, but is on the whole a good complete copy. In the Tabula there are MS additions by a contemporary hand, inside front and end-cover there is a poem in hexameters on the holy mass in a XVth century hand-writing.

This celebrated poem was composed by Melchior Pfintzing at the instance of Maximilian I. on the occasion of the marriage of the latter to Marie de Bourgogne: indeed it is known that the Emperor contributed largely to the work himself. The woodcuts in this 3rd edition are the same as in the extremely rare 1st and 2nd editions. It is curious to remark that in cut No. 70 the original head of the central figure has been cut away and another one inserted by dropping a small block into the large one. In this and a few of the others, Schaufelein's monogram is cut away, although his distinctive mark of a shovel remains. There is also evidence of another signature (of another artist) having been cut away on the same block. At the end of the poem is the Privilege containing the name of Pfintzing.

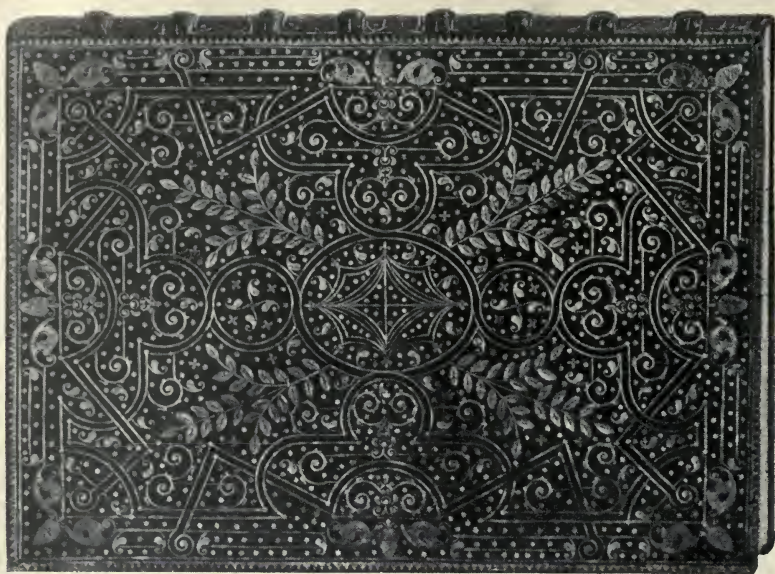

The book is an early specimen of the first press at Fano, printing being first introduced there in 1502. It is also the first book with cuts produced at this town. The illustrations, though considered as woodcuts, were probably cut on metal. The artist was the brother of the celebrated Venetian engraver, Zoan Andrea. The initials F. V. occur on the large engraving of the Descent of the Holy Spirit. The second picture, that of the Adoration of the Shepherds, is signed with a small 2 (as in the Missale Predicatorum of 1522) which points to another cutter or the designer. Three others of the cuts are unsigned „quoiqu'elles appartiennent aux meilleures du livre et qu'elles indiquent clairement l'école de Jean Bellin“ (Pass).

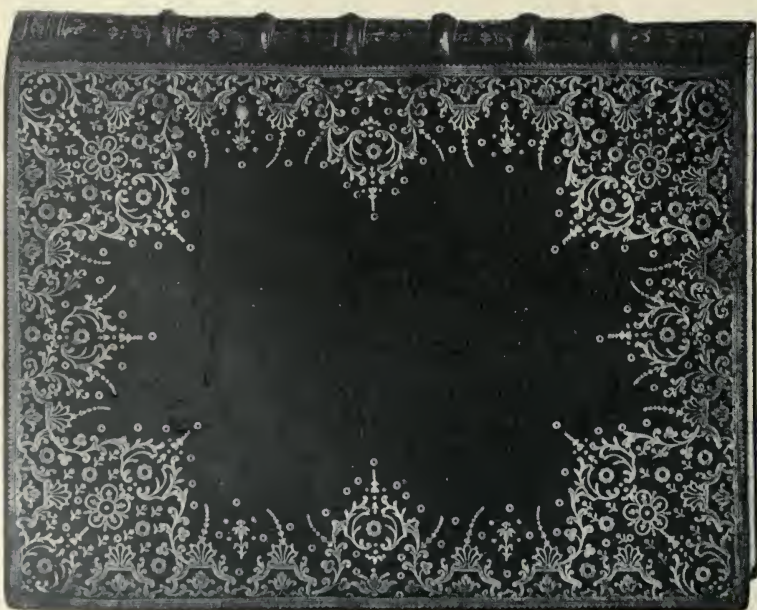

Although in most known MSS (as in ours) this didactic poem in Italian ottave rime is attributed to Gregorio (Goro) Dati, a well known versifier, it is now considered probable that not he, but his brother, Leonardo Dati, General of the Dominican Order and one of the judges of John Huss at the Council of Constance, born Florence 1365, died there 1424, buried in Sta Maria Novella, should be considered the author, possibly he wrote this treatise in Latin and his brother Goro translated it into Italian verse.

The „Sfera“ treats of Cosmography (The globe, zones, equinoxes, eclipses, the planets, the seasons etc.) and in the third book of Geography in particular, giving mainly a description of the sea-coasts of Europe, Africa and Asia stopping in the Black Sea at the River Don, evidently based on contemporary portulans and sailing directions; the use of the compass and of the watch for determining the longitude at sea are mentioned. Accordingly the illustrations of the first part show the firmament, the zodiac, diagrams of the eclipses, a world-map (on fol. 7 verso) etc. and in the third book, surrounding the margins of every page, give something like maps of the countries described in the text. — Thus on fol. 15—16 we have a map from Cairo to the mouth of the Don showing Niniveh, Bagdad, Jerusalem, and Noah's Ark perched high on Mount Ararat, and the Red Sea painted red. On fol. 17 the Tower of Babel. On fol. 19 the coasts of Northern Africa and Spain. On fol. 21 verso Palestine and the Syrian coast.

A similar manuscript of the Sfera was owned by G. Libri, who reproduces the world map from his specimen in his „Monuments Inédits“ Pl. LIV. and speaks at length of the poem in his „Histoire des Sciences Mathématiques en Italie“ II. p. 221. — See also „Bibliofilia“ VII.
