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Shopping

Bring an empty bag with you to Cape Town because chances are that you'll be leaving laden with local booty. The city's irresistible range of products – from modern African beadwork to fine wines – is guaranteed to turn the most consumer-averse visitor into a shopaholic.

Local design and fashion are really taking off (see p18), so if you want to give your wardrobe or home that contemporary African look, Cape Town is the place to go shopping. The city also acts as a clearing house for antiques and curios from all over Africa and you'll find some amazing pieces here – as well as plenty of fakes! If you're looking for simple gifts but don't want tacky touristy stuff (of which there's also plenty), go for township-produced crafts made from recycled bottles, cans and old food labels; you'll often be helping people who are struggling with poverty and HIV/AIDS. For other ideas, see below.

For one-stop shopping you still can't beat the mega malls such as the Waterfront's Victoria Wharf (Map pp252-3; @ 021-408 7600; www.waterfront.co.za; Waterfront; 🕑 9am-9pm), Canal Walk (Map pp244-5; @ 0860 101 165; www.canalwalk.co.za; Century Blvd, Century City, Milnerton; 💮 9am-9pm), or Cavendish Square (Map pp246-7; @ 021-671 8042; www.caven dish.co.za; Cavendish St, Claremont; 💮 9am-6pm Mon-Thu, 9am-9pm Fri, 9am-6pm Sat, 10am-4pm Sun), all hugely popular for their range of shops, long opening hours and cheap or free parking. The increase in residential units in the City Bowl also means there's an increasingly lively shopping scene there; watch out for developments around the new Rhodes Mandela Place (Map pp248-9). And don't miss out on sampling one of Cape Town's several lively craft and flea markets (see the boxed text, p162).

Opening Hours

Most shops, particularly those in the City Bowl area, open from 8.30am to 5pm Monday to Friday and 8.30am to 1pm Saturday. If opening hours are not given in the listings in this chapter you can assume these hours apply. Shopping centres keep longer hours and are often open daily.

Consumer Taxes

South Africa has a value-added tax (VAT) of 14%. Foreign visitors can reclaim some of their VAT expenses on departure. For details, see p218.

Bargaining

When buying handicrafts from street hawkers and at some market stalls, bargaining is expected but isn't the sophisticated game that is often played in Asia. Don't press too hard.

TOP FIVE BEST BUYS

There are some brilliant original designer goods on sale in the Mother City. If we had to choose only five to take home, the following would be on our shopping list:

- Heath Nash lampshades (p168) Nash's Flowerball and Curl lampshades elevate recycled plastic to an arty level. Also check out his wirework Soccerbowls and Life is Beautiful Here coat rack.
- Imagenius baby booties (p162) if only these adorably cute dyed-buckskin baby booties came in adult sizes!
- Monkeybiz beadwork we defy you to leave Cape Town without one of Monkeybiz' colourful dolls, animals or
 placemats. Hand over your credit card at the Bo-Kaap shop (p162) or at Carrol Boyes (p166) at the Waterfront.
- Nguni Cows from Streetwires (p163) more brilliant beadwork in these richly patterned cow sculptures designed by Elias Kahari and Michaela Howse.
- Philippa Green bracelet (p165) the embroidered Perspex cuffs of this young jewellery designer are seen on the smartest of Capetonian wrists. Also on sale at Monkeybiz (p162) and Africa Nova (p163).

CITY CENTRE CITY BOWL & BO-KAAP

Pedestrianised St George's Mall, thronged with stalls selling art and fashion, is always an interesting browse. Adderley St, once Cape Town's principal shopping strip, is coming back to life, while the southern end of Long St is the place to head for second-hand books, antiques and streetwear boutiques. There are plenty of interesting galleries (see the boxed text, p164) to explore in the City Bowl. The whole area is best explored during the week though; it's dead from Saturday afternoon to Monday morning.

TOP FIVE MARKETS

You'll have fun hunting through Cape Town's many craft markets for the authentic, quality items amid the piles of cheap tourist-trade stuff. The Market at Grand Parade (Map pp248-9) on Wednesday and Saturday doesn't sell much of interest to visitors, but it's certainly lively, with people scrambling for bargains, mainly clothing.

Green Point Market (Map pp252–3; Green Point Stadium, Western Blvd, Green Point; 🟵 8.30am-6pm Sun) Held in the main parking lot in front of the stadium, this craft market is one of the best places to hunt for inexpensive African art, fabrics and clothes.

Greenmarket Square (Map pp248–9; cnr Shortmarket & Berg Sts, City Bowl; 🕑 9am-4pm Mon-Sat) Masks, iewellery, bargain CDs, pottery and the satirical, anticorporate T-shirts of Laugh It Off are just some of the finds at this market, held in cobbled Greenmarket Sq.

Hout Bay Craft Market (Map p258; 🖻 021-790 3474; Baviaanskloof Rd, Hout Bay; 🏵 10am-5pm Sun) Held on the village green, this is a great alternative to Green Point Market, offering lots of great crafts made by local people, including the paper products of Iziko lo Lwazi (p168).

Kirstenbosch Craft Market (Map pp244–5; 🗃 021-671 5468; cnr Kirstenbosch & Rhodes Drs, Newlands; 🕎 9am-5pm last Sun of month) Proceeds from this craft market go to the development fund for Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens. Mr Mather's handmade wooden toys are worth looking out for.

Milnerton Flea Market (Map pp244–5; 🛱 021-550 1383; Racecourse Rd, Milnerton; 🕎 7am-3pm Sat & Sun) Hunt for genuine antiques at bargain prices at this car-boot sale in an industrial corner of Cape Town. With patience and luck you'll find collectable china, glass and furnishings.
