British Museum Reading Room



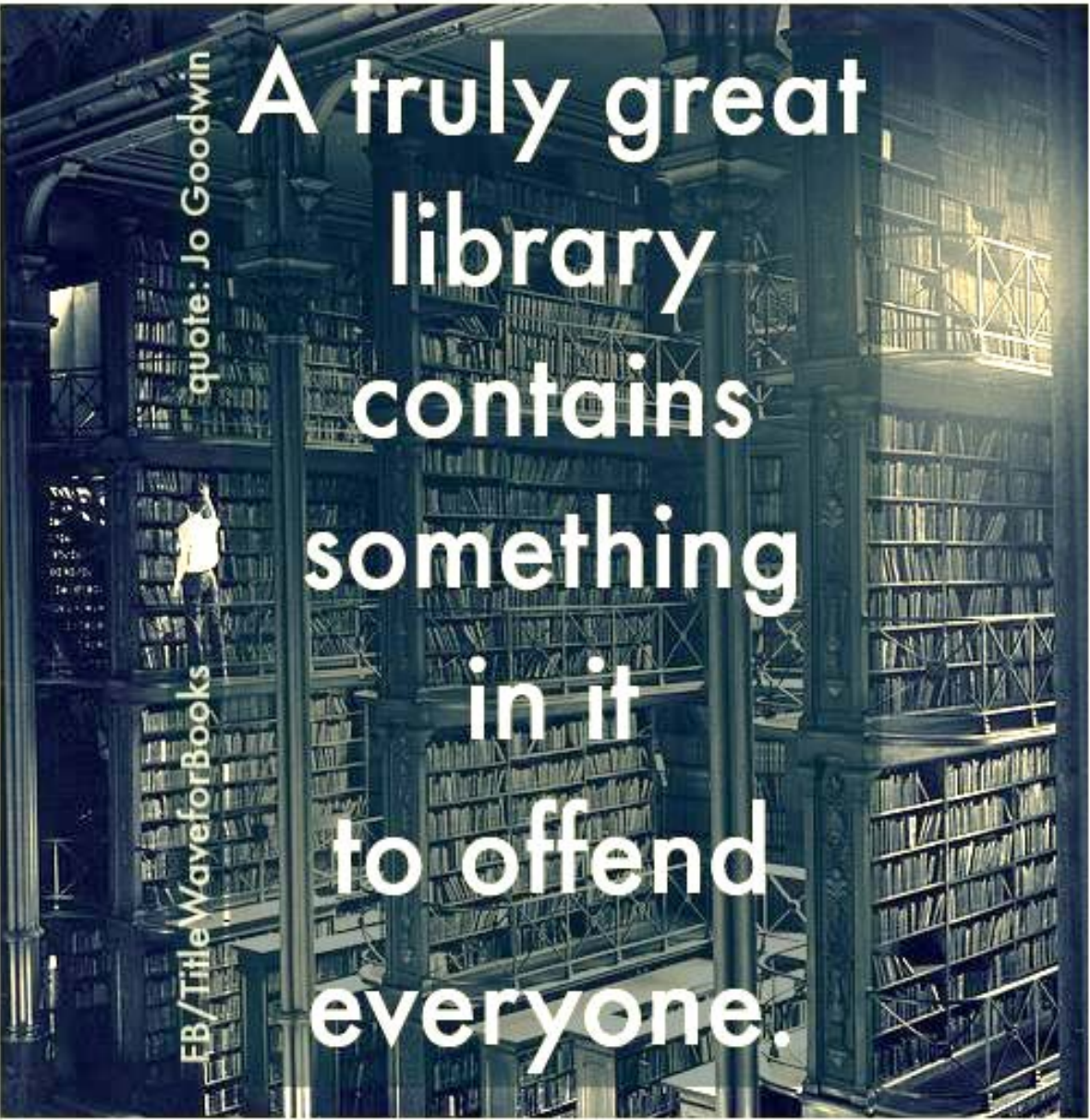

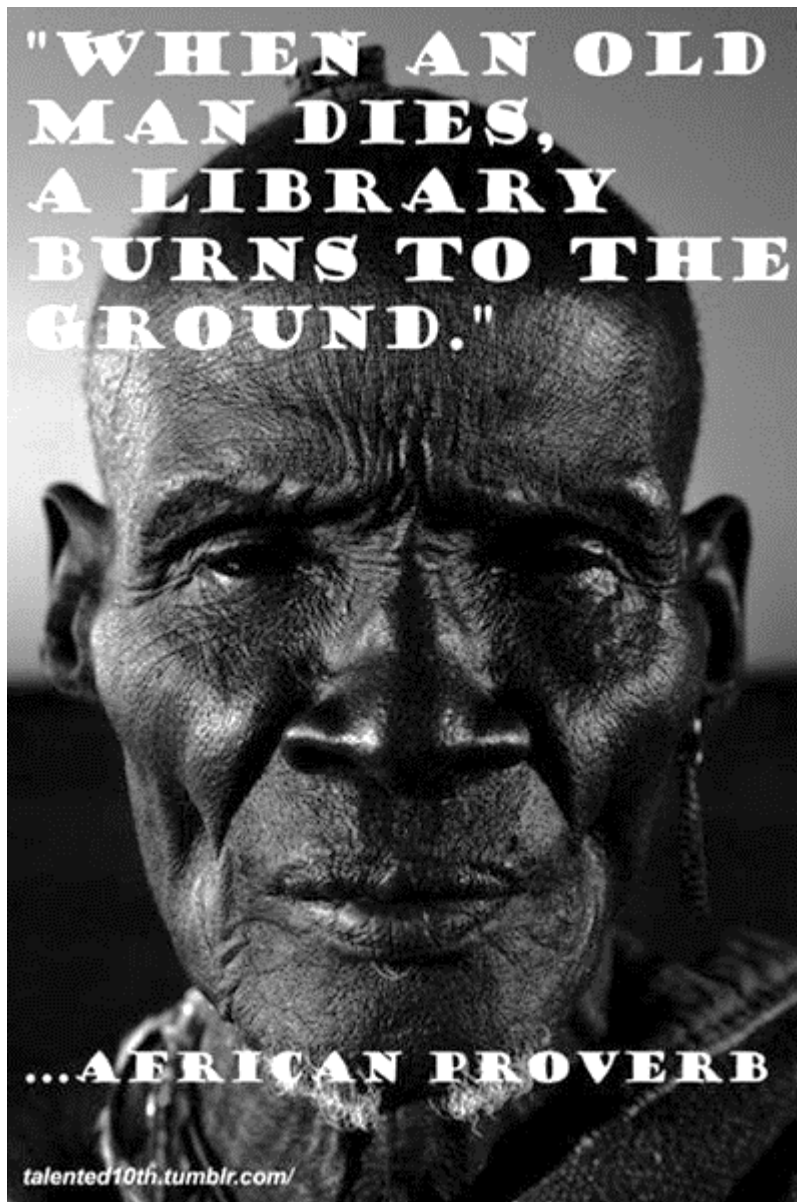

This electronic library is not a finished product but it is the foundation for a world library as future items and Medias develop. This library works best on a windows system.

This library is from the efforts of Project Gutenberg's with over 45 years of work from 1972 to the present, including over 125,000 books from the USA, Australia & Canada. There are over 18,000 books from www.archive.org incredible efforts (search A.O.pdf). Sacred-texts.com organized by John Bruno Hare 1955 - 2010 has over 8,000

books in "World Lending Library". Many hundreds of other varied sources have also been used.

You need to spend an hour or more to understand its simple organization.

When you enter "World Lending Library" there are 39 Folders representing 39 rooms for each subject library, IE, Science, Beliefs, Myths & History, Philosophy-Psychology, etc. and under that are included an extensive general reference library. Like you walk into a very large physical library and there stands the librarian and you ask her where the Science or the Myths & History room are and she points to another room entrance. Behind or near her in the entrance room is an extensive general reference library. Thus they are separate, FOLDERS (rooms) and then an extensive general reference library.

Then you go into the Science reading room to see the librarian standing there and you ask her where the Biology or Astronomy or Physics & Math rooms are and she points you in the proper room thus FOLDERS are at the top and then you notice that behind or near her in the entrance room is an extensive general Science reference library.

Then you go into the Biology reading room to see the librarian standing there and you ask her where the Evolution & Darwin or books by Darwin, Charles Robert 1809-1882 are and she points you in the proper room thus FOLDERS are at the top and then you notice that behind or near her in the entrance room is an extensive general Biology reference library. (NOTE: Copy the Library, exactly like the original copy (pictured above), DIRECTLY onto the OPENING WINDOW (Screen) of any new external hard drive or the "C" drive of your computer, always make a new folder for the entire library named "WLL". Do this because book file names are often long and you will get a notice that many books cannot be copied because the file name is too long. When copying to any new external hard drive you must right click in "My Computer" on the new hard drive and do a "Quick Format". Any provided software on the new hard drive is no good, as when you rename any file it will back it up as a second copy....SEE - 2 - How to Make Copies of WORLD LENDING LIBRARY

If you put the "World Lending Library" on the internet you MUST put a password so that Google cannot do a general search and just any person can go and download the books. This would become a copyright issue and could bring you unnecessary problems. We also strongly recommend that since the library is only 4.25TBs that you copy it on to 2 different hard drive areas of your server or 2 separate external hard drives as a backup in case one copy fails the other copy can be quickly used. I have not had any luck using the "Teracopy" program as it freezes up and you will not know how to continue. Windows copy system works fine and you can pull up to 6 or 7 different selections at the same time and as they, each selection, finishes you will select another few items to copy, always keeping it to 8 or 10 copy windows at any time. Follow to the exact order of the original hard drive layout.....not that difficult.

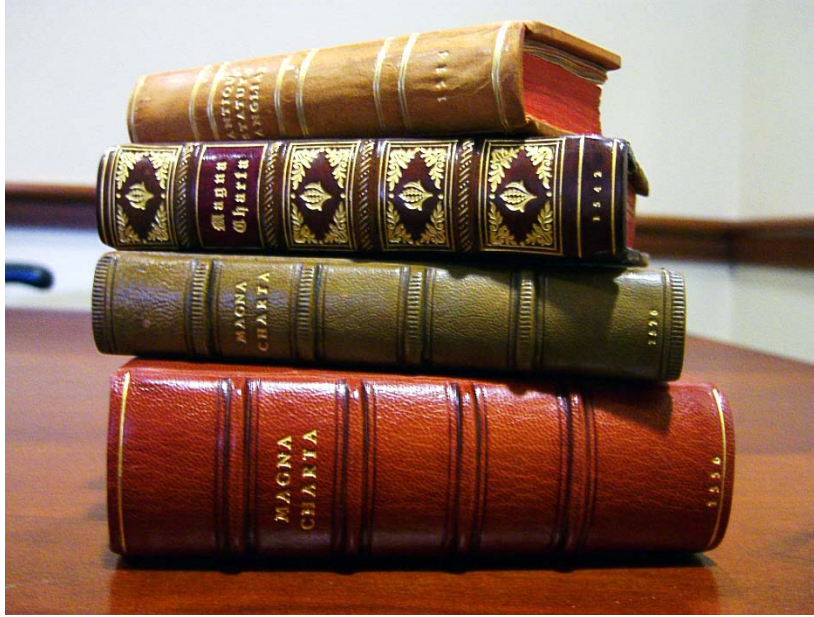

Now shall I put a copy on your flash drive?"

You call the old librarian on the phone and ask: "Do you have that book in your library? Yes and because of budget cuts we are only open at, such in such, limited hours and we are located across town, be on time."

You call the modern e-texts librarian: "Do you have that book in your library? Yes of course as we do not have to build thousands of shelves and have acres of space we have a lot of money for all the e-texts we get. You ask the modern e-texts librarian: "Where can I find in this 500 page book the information about "Atlantis" I need. You can click CTRL + F and type in "Atlantis" and find any information instantly and can copy it instantly onto your own notes, so enjoy."

You ask the old librarian: "How many copies are there of that rare book and can I borrow it? No there is only one copy and you must use it after getting permission, in our library, only.

You ask the modern e-texts librarian: How many copies are there of that rare book and can I borrow it? Of course, we can make millions of copies of that rare book. Now, shall I put a copy on your flash drive?"

You ask the old librarian: "I am a slow reader, my English isn't so good and I have trouble reading or my eyes are not as good as they used to be, can someone read to me? We have a few audio books and that is all we can do for you."

You ask the modern e-texts librarian: "I am a slow reader, my English isn't so good and I have trouble reading or my eyes are not as good as they used to be, can someone read to me? You can go on the net and download Natural Reader. This will read any books or papers instantly, and even your email, anything on your computers clipboard. have only a couple but they are checked out now for two weeks and there are three people waiting for it before you, shall I add you to the list?"

You ask the modern e-texts librarian: "I enjoyed that book by that author. Do you have any speeches or talks or documentaries by him or on that subject? Yes of course they are all together in our "" E-texts Library of the Future" which is here NOW. So, shall I put a copy of all you are requesting on your flash drive?"

You ask the old librarian: "Do you have that book in your library? What is the ISBN (International Standard Book Number) number?"

You ask the modern e-texts librarian: "Do you have that book in your library and do I need the ISBN (International Standard Book Number) number? No, I can search for your book by authors name or any keyword or even the date in a couple seconds. You only need ISBN numbers for hard texts for locating them or ordering them from a bookstore.
